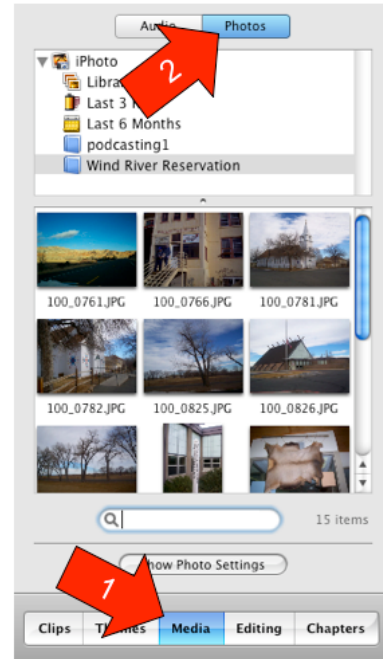


Lesson 4. Still Images in iMovie

Step 1: Import Your Images. There are several sources for photos in a movie, including:

- ✓ If you have images in iPhoto, you can import them directly through the iMovie interface:
 - Select the *Media* button.
 - Click *Photos* at the top of the Media pane.
 - To add a photo to your movie, drag it from the images pane to the clip viewer or timeline viewer.

- ✓ To add photos from your computer:
 - Select *Import* from the File menu.
 - Browse to the file you want to import and click *Open*.



Step 2: Adding motion effects. You can alter the impact of a still image by panning across the image or by zooming in or out. In iMovie, this is called “Ken Burns Effect,” named after the famous documentary film maker. To add a “Ken Burns Effect” to a photo:

- ✓ Select the photo in the clip viewer or timeline viewer.
- ✓ Click *Show Photo Setting* in the Media pane.
- ✓ Select the Ken Burns Effect checkbox in the Photo Settings Window.
- ✓ Set the desired *Start* and *End* points:
 - *Panning* effects are achieved by clicking directly on the image in the preview window and dragging it to a desired spot.
 - *Zooming* effects are achieved by dragging the zoom control.
 - The speed of the motion can be changed with the duration control.
- ✓ Use the preview controls to preview the overall effect.
- ✓ To apply your changes to a photo you've selected in the movie, click *Apply*.
